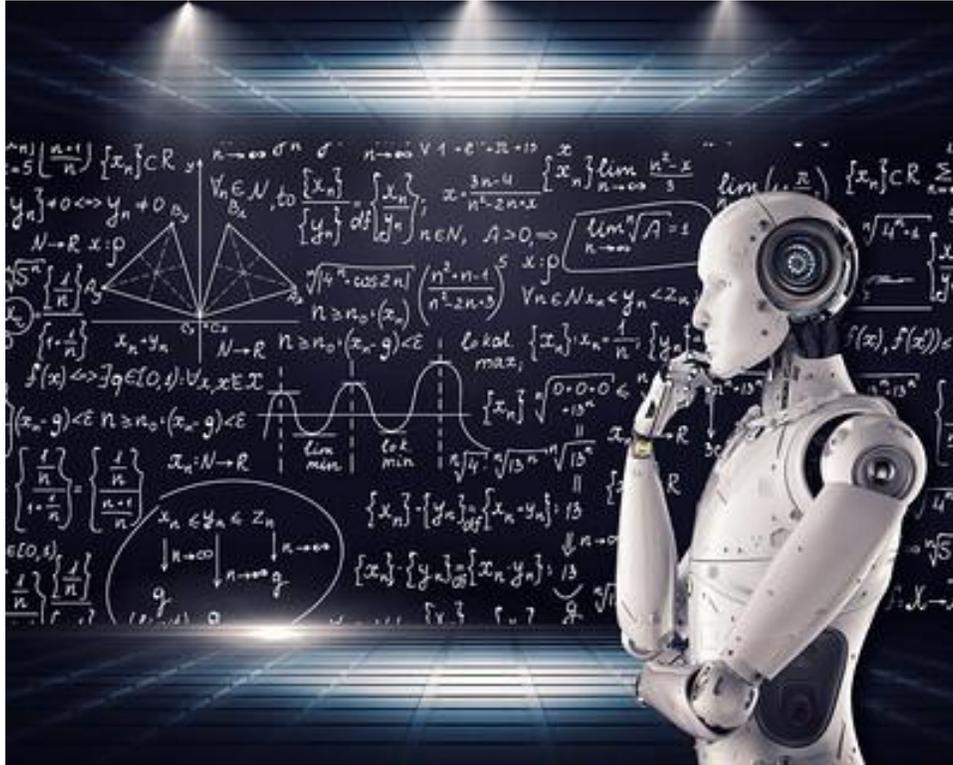




Teaching with AI in Spring 2024: A Resource Sharing Newsletter
