- identify as blended professionals (defined as those who have advanced degrees and multiple years of professional experience) working in academic third spaces, such as library services, academic support services, teaching and learning, and other support staff.
- are an adult (18 years or older).
- hold a master's degree or higher.
- have worked as a professional in higher education for at least 5 years.

Participation Details:

- Your input will be invaluable in shaping a new perspective on academic leadership.
- Interviews will be conducted via Zoom, ensuring flexibility and convenience, and will last approximately 60 minutes.
- Your identity and responses will be treated with the utmost confidentiality.
