

The Conference on College Composition and Communication Committee on Computers and Composition (7Cs) is accepting proposals for the 2026 Digital Praxis Posters (DPP) at the Conference on College Composition and Communication (CCCC) in Cleveland, Ohio. DPP sessions provide a space for scholars and practitioners from across our field to share and discuss their innovative work with digital and emerging technologies. The DDP invites a variety of work ranging from experimentation with new digital tools to the methodologies shaping research using these tools. The goal of the DPP is to network and discuss writing, rhetoric, and communication with students, scholars, and/or organizations where digital praxis is enacted. Sessions are interactive and filled with engaging conversations about research and teaching projects related to writing and digital technologies. We build community by encouraging dialogue across sessions and offer mentoring in the preparation and delivery of their presentations. In 2026, digital poster proposals are invited in the following categories:

1. Demonstrations of digital tools
2. Digital pedagogy assignments
3. Researching or using digital tools and emerging technologies
4. Digital facets of community, advocacy, and justice
5. Creative digital projects
6. Issues of labor in digital spaces
7. Experimentations with Artificial Intelligence (AI) and/or other emerging technologies
